

We miss the multi-varied opportunities to worship and fellowship as we celebrate the incarnation of Jesus our Lord. With so many of us isolated in 2020, we decided to offer a short home-led worship experience in addition to our Christmas Eve worship service.

Liturgy means "work of the people." Therefore we have formatted this short worship time for one person to read, or as an outline to inspire creativity. Doing just the sections in **blue should take about 15 minutes**. Using the entire liturgy will take about 45 minutes.

You will note suggestions for each section at the end of the booklet. There are suggestions for little children, teenagers, young adults, and older adults. Think of these suggestions as options on a buffet—don't try to do all of them or the experience won't be so wonderful. Spend some time before Christmas Eve reviewing the booklet to consider how you will conduct your home led worship experience. You may feel free to ignore the suggestions and read/sing the liturgy as printed. When our hearts sincerely worship, God is pleased.

We have included numbered liturgy cards that can be cut and distributed to each person present. They can be read by each person at the appropriate time. — Lighting of the Advent Wreath —

We light this candle in hope. *Light 1st candle.*

We light this candle for peace. *Light 2nd candle.*

We light this candle in joy. Light 3rd candle (pink).

We light this candle in love. *Light 4th candle.*

Now our redemption draws near! Light center candle (white). Our Scripture reading is from Isaiah 9:2–3 and 6–7.

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.

You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder.

For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named
Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom.
He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore.
The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

— Suggestions for Each Section —

GENERAL

- Review all the suggestions and decide how you want to proceed. Don't feel the need to use suggestions from each section. A few well-chosen options that fit your group can be very meaningful.
- Feel free to incorporate your own ideas or ideas from other members of the family.
- The verses of each song are printed in the liturgy booklet. The verses listed are the ones that are sung on the YouTube videos that have been selected. Feel free to look in a hymnal and add additional verses. Invite family musicians to play. Play the song on Spotify as accompaniment or use the playlist on FPC's YouTube channel (search for "FPC Ashland").
- Decide if you will use the liturgy cards. Cut the cards. Designate who will
 coordinate the whole service. Review the cards and consider the reading
 level of each person before handing them out. Some people might want
 to see their part ahead of time.

PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

 Ask each person ahead of time to think about one thing they love about someone else who will be in the service. Give a time at the end of the Preparation for Worship reading to share what they love about another person. As the leader, be prepared to share something you love about each person to ensure something affirming is said about everyone.

CALL TO WORSHIP

- If you are using this as a responsive reading, make copies of this card for everyone. Designate a leader and have everyone read in unison the bold sections.
- Each of the group lines has an exclamation mark! Encourage people to say it loud and with expression.
- If you have small children consider replacing each response line with the words "Let us go find the Savior!" They can easily memorize this and say at the appropriate time.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

- Set up a candle ahead of time that someone in the family can light when the Advent Prayer is read.
- Locate or make a simple Advent Wreath. Set it up ahead of time. Decide
 who will read the message and who will light the candles. The order of
 lighting and the meaning of each candle is written in the service.

INTRODUCTION TO THE SCRIPTURES

- When reading the passages, choose a good reader who is comfortable reading out loud.
- You may choose a less familiar version of the Bible to read from. If you have little children you can use a children's Bible. The Message can be used for a fresh read.
- You might like to use the first two minutes of this YouTube dramatic reading for the Luke 2:1–20 passage (listen ahead of time). To access this video, click onto *Playlist Song #7* or search for "Luke 2 NIV Dramatized Audio Bible" on YouTube.
