FPC will have our own "Souper" Bowl Sunday on February 1, our next Celebration Sunday. We will:




- Encourage people to bring in cans of soup to donate to Associated Charities in addition to our regular Hunger Sunday donations

CHRISTIAN SYMBOL Sand dollar

These circular shells in shades of white, brown or purple are from sea urchins related to starfish and sea cucumbers. The shell's



unique characteristics call to mind Christ's birth and death: the poinsettia- and lily-like images, holes representing the four nails and spear that pierced Jesus, small bones inside the shell resembling doves and thus symbolizing the Holy Spirit.

The Legend of the Sand Dollar

There's a pretty little legend that I would like to tell Of the birth and death of Jesus found in this lowly shell.

If you examine closely, you'll see that you find here Four nail holes and a fifth hole, made by a Roman's spear.

On one side the Easter lily, its center is the star That appeared unto the shepherds and led them from afar.

The Christmas poinsettia etched on the other side Reminds us of his birthday, our happy Christmastide.

Now break the center open, and here you will release The five white doves awaiting to spread good will and peace.

This simple little symbol, Christ left for you and me To help us spread his Gospel, through all eternity.
