

Formational Prayer Seminar June 10-13, 2015

Dr. Terry Wardle leads seminars in formational prayer two times a year at the Ashland Theological Seminary. Formational Prayer is a ministry of the Holy Spirit, moving through a Christian caregiver, bringing the Healing Presence of Jesus Christ into the place of pain and brokenness within a wounded person.

Program Objectives:

- Equip caregivers for good self-care
- Provide tools for addressing dysfunctional behaviors
- Develop sound techniques for emotional healing
- Teach steps for dealing with deep wounds
- Present information on spirituality and world view as each relates to helping the broken
- Demonstrate pathways that help people dismantle destructive, false beliefs

Toxic Charity Workshop with Bob Lupton

"Giving to those in need what they could be gaining from their own initiative may well be the kindest way to destroy people."

Bob Lupton has spent over four decades working in inner-city Atlanta and beyond to develop models that are effective and truly serve the poor. Lupton, a trained psychologist, and his wife moved from the suburbs and raised their family living in the inner-city of Atlanta. By observations and by building relationships of trust, Lupton has seen the transformation of people out of poverty and their neighborhoods change from dangerous and blighted to thriving and eve successful. His first hand experience and writing comes from working with churches, government agencies entrepreneurs, and volunteers seeing that many good intentions can translate into ineffective care or even harm. He reveals the shockingly toxic effects that modern charity has upon the very people meant to benefit from it. Toxic Charity provides proven new models for charitable groups who want to help—not sabotage—those whom they desire to serve. His groundbreaking Toxic Charity shows us how to start serving needy and impoverished members of our communities in a way that will lead to lasting, real-world change.

Prayer

The Bible tells us that the power working in us is the same power that raised Jesus Christ from the dead. "I pray that you will begin to understand how incredibly great His power is to help; those



who believe Him. It is that same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead and seated Him in the place of honor at God's right hand in heaven." Ephesians 1:19-20

Here is a story demonstrating this verse. There was a church service beginning but when the organist sat down at the organ to play, nothing came from the instrument. The pastor determined to go ahead without music and read the Scripture for the morning. Then he prayed. As the story is told, it was after the prayer that music was restored and the people sang, "Praise God from Whom all blessings flow." Prayer can make the distinction between operating in human power or God's power.

God's prayer room is always open to those in need. His telephone line is in service twenty-four hours a day. Our line to Him is never busy. No matter how many are praying at the same time, He never misses one prayer. He may not answer immediately or in the manner we choose. Those are the times He calls us to have faith and trust in Him and His discerning ways.

Property Commission

The lighting project is progressing and we have received a picture of the refurbished fixture which had been removed. It is beautiful

and will reflect back to the opening of the church. That fixture will be used as a template for all the others when the lift is finally available to remove the remaining fixtures. The lift we need is very unique and is presently on a job in Virginia. BCU is our electrical contractor for the work and once the lift arrives the project will probably done in about a month. Partial payments have been sent for the lighting upgrade work.

The kitchenette sink repair is done and the lights will be replaced in the kitchenette soon.

The concrete contract with Lee's is signed. We are on the schedule to repair sidewalks, curbs and parking lot apron.

Meetings with contractors will begin for the sound system upgrade as funds from capital funds will permit. Pastor Mike is handling the negotiations.

Other housekeeping chores are being met and addressed as we are aware of them.

A big event coming up is the work week where the congregation takes ownership of the building and we will clean up and organize.
