

We want to personally thank you for yet another successful tournament in 2015. This vear we moved our location to Mohican Hills and the results could not have been better! 100 golfers came out to support our event and our numbers are now holding steady from year to year. The first year that we took over the event, we raised \$1,100 and last year we saw that increase to \$1,975. This year, with your help and with the generosity of all of our participants and donors, we were able to donate \$3,750 directly into the Michael L. Runyan Memorial Scholarship, administered by the Ashland County Community Foundation. Our move to Mohican Hills had a major impact in our ability to maximize our donation while also keeping our entry fees affordable for our golfers. We feel that we've found a great home for the event at Mohican Hills and will return there next year, with the tournament taking place on August 20th, 2016.
