Such wounds often generate destructive false beliefs, debilitating emotional turmoil, and countless dysfunctional behaviors in the lives of God's people. Through formational prayer, hurting people are able to experience the transforming power of Christ that brings freedom and release.

2015 saw a lot of improvements as we complete the 200 for 200 projects. We are beginning to reap the benefit of the heating system upgrade and the lights have really made the sanctuary beautiful. The audio system contract is pending approval and work should begin soon. The sound difference should be equally impressive. Thank you for your support and your pledges. We have been able to pay for these projects with money in hand.

I encourage your support of the property fund to buy the middle school property. The impact of the possible loss of parking lot and adjoining property has already affected us as the demolition of the school proceeds. It is a unique opportunity to purchase this land. If we fail in our bid for the land, the money would be applied to permanent improvement fund.
