ACCESS UPDATE

Success! Soup-er Saturday, the most recent fundraiser for ACCESS, raised approximately \$5,000 to support this ongoing community and church program

that provides temporary housing for women and children currently lacking housing. To all those who provided auction items, baked goods and assistance in set-up and clean-up, as well as those who enjoyed the soup, entered bids in the silent auction, and purchased raffle tickets, a hearty "thank you!" is due.

Change in operation - Rather than host ACCESS guests in the rotation of churches, guests are being housed in apartments until more permanent housing is available. Churches continue to provide groceries and meals as needed by guests, and contribute to the utility costs.

Currently needed for the apartments are paper towels, toilet paper, and laundry detergent. The items are not covered by SNAP cards, so often our guests go without. If you can help in this way, donations can be placed in a labeled carton in the office area at church. Your ongoing donations of hotel soaps, shampoo, lotion continue to be appreciated. Thank you!


