
During 2016, gifts from this congregation as well as countless others, provided well over \$1 million in grants to 29 states to alleviate crises caused by natural disasters as well as church fires and human-caused disasters. More than 8,800 work team volunteers served in areas of need. Internationally, nearly \$3 million in grants went to 21 nations to support emergency needs as well as provide sustainable water and sanitation systems.
