It is hard to believe that the Season of Advent is upon us. It was truly only a few years ago when I began to understand the significance of Advent in regards to the Christian faith. While it does lead up to the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, it symbolizes so much more for us. I appreciate these words: “The season of Advent, a season of waiting, is designed to cultivate our awareness of God’s actions – past, present, and future. In Advent we hear the prophecies of the Messiah’s coming as addressed to us – people who wait for the second coming. In Advent we heighten our anticipation for the ultimate fulfillment of all Old Testament promises, when the wolf

will lie down with the lamb, death will be swallowed up, and every tear will be wiped away. In this way Advent highlights for us the larger story of God’s redemptive plan.” (taken from *The Worship Sourcebook*)

The Season of Advent is an opportunity for us to reflect upon our lives and faith in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Christ came into the world - the Word became Flesh and dwelt among us. Immanuel – God is with us. Jesus came into this world to “do life” with us – to chat, to eat, to hang out, to dwell, to be in relationship with us! And while Christ’s presence remains with us through the ministry of the Holy Spirit, a

## Created for Relationship

### We were created for relationship.

This truth finds its root at our beginning (Alpha), in Genesis 1 & 2.

Everyday, Jake and I encounter college students who were created for relationship. Yet, we live in this world where sin destroys and shame fuels isolation. Like many of us, **college students live in the tension of both deeply desiring and fearing vulnerable relationships.**

In his book, *The Soul of Shame*, Curt Thompson speaks of the remedy for our isolation: “But it is in the movement toward another, toward connection with someone who is safe, that we come to know life and freedom from this prison.” Safe relationships are the connections we long for.

This fall, we had the opportunity to facilitate an Alpha course with two student leaders. ***Let us tell you about Daniel, who continually showed up to Alpha due to the work of God and your faithful prayers.*** With each Tuesday night meeting, Daniel slowly began to share stories of his past experiences with faith. He grew up in a Catholic school before turning away from faith in the 7th grade. Daniel isn’t a believer, but every week he fully engaged, offering thoughtful comments about Jesus; he seemed to have a growing respect for a Christian faith that was different than the one he encountered when he was younger. Daniel has shown an appreciation for the Alpha leaders that have welcomed him and his beliefs, no matter where they fall on the spectrum of faith. One thing is certain --God has not given up on Daniel.



Let us continue to champion the real connection students long for in relationship with God and others. Here are some practical ways to do that this winter:

**Pray:** Pray for non-believing students like Daniel, Priya (below), and Dawn (above) to have eyes to see the truth about their need and about Jesus.

**Sit:** Do you have any home projects that AU students could help complete in order to earn money for the 2018 Jubilee Conference? We’d love see more students be able to attend the conference. As we recruit, we see the need to help students find ways to raise support!

**Go:** Join us on the evening of Saturday, December 16th as we share a multi-ethnic meal, prepared by international students in the fellowship hall at FPC!




Once known as “mission committee,” the Evangelism and Outreach (E & O) is striving for more active involvement and commitment in the community, beyond merely allocating the budgeted mission dollars. While some activities may be limited to once a year (CROP walk, Warm and Fuzzy Tree as examples), several will be on-going, such as filling needs for ACCESS. Hunger Sunday, our monthly donations to the food pantry at Associated Charities, will continue to be encouraged, with greater emphasis on specific items as appropriate. Pleasant Hill Outdoor Center not only receives monetary support, but eagerly welcomes volunteers to help with mailings to campers and supporters. We are building stronger ties with Safe Haven Domestic Violence services, and planning to hold training for volunteers. Sending Spanish Bibles for women in Honduras and Dominican Republic with Tia Sponsler on her visits there will provide for many their first exposure to the written Word.

7 year-old Tania in Bangladesh writes that her favorite day of the week is Friday when she can travel with her parents. Playing dolls with her friends is her favorite activity.


Juana from Guatemala wrote the following: I am wearing a corte (Guatemalan typical skirt), which is the costume of my town. The corte we wear is made in a pedal loom, the men of my town work it out and our guipil (typical blouse), is hand-knit. I want you to know that my mom can knit guipiles with different kinds of embroidery. Almost all the boys wear pants now a day, but in my case I just wear pants for physical education.

I want to tell you about my last medical checkup. It was a good report, but I have caries. My medical checkup was done here at the Heraldos del Rey Child Development Center. My mom came with me to my medical checkup because I always have the support of my mom. I thank my tutor because she gives me the talks about how to wash my hands, how to brush my teeth, how to bathe, she also gives me information about the common illnesses and how to eat healthy. I like fruit especially watermelon and pineapple. The vegetables I like are carrots and squash, I like them in beef broth. Do you like watermelon? Do you like carrots? I will always thank you and ask you to pray for my family. I wish great blessings in your spiritual and material life. Thank you for the letters you sent me. Bye for now with a smile for you.
