Let's celebrate some of the great things that have happened with Ashland students during the spring semester:

- In February, FPC hosted a Chinese New Year celebration where nearly 100 students, church congregants, and community members came together to share a meal, get to know each other, and watch international students display their gifts and talents on stage.
- Jake and I got to spend 3 days with 9 AU students, along with several other young families from FPC, in Pittsburgh at the Jubilee Conference. Here, students heard about the redemptive power available for believers through Jesus Christ. For Yayu, a Chinese student, Jubilee offered her a deeper understanding of the life offered through Jesus, and in the weeks to follow, she committed her life to him. We rejoice in this!
- The day before Easter, Yayu, was baptized along with two others. Together with the Chinese church congregants, a few FPC members got to celebrate these young women's new lives in Jesus.
- Peggy and Steve Yoder opened their cabin to welcome 30 international students and celebrate their graduation. Together, we

Compassion INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY MAY 6, 2018

WHAT IS COMPASSION SUNDAY? Compassion Sunday is a national movement that starts with local churches. It strengthens church communities, deepens believers' faith in Christ and unites the worldwide body of Christ.

HOW DOES IT WORK? Individual sponsors provide the means to a brighter future for select children around the world who would otherwise continue to live in poverty and hopelessness. Each sponsored child is nurtured physically, emotionally and socially at a child development center in an evangelical, neighborhood church. Children hear the gospel of Jesus and have the opportunity to experience faith in Jesus that endures into adulthood.

HOW CAN I RESPOND? On May 6, select a packet describing a child designated by Compassion International who would benefit from regular support, providing basic necessities and educational opportunities. Packets will be available in the lounge following worship where you can speak with others already sponsoring children. Once registered, you will begin receiving additional information about the child's country of origin, then communications from your child will begin as your sponsorship becomes effective.

Compassion's blog is their way to share the most recent and powerful stories while providing a more personal look into poverty. 
