



One of these possibilities has recently come to us. After months of conversation, prayer, and discernment the Session voted to hire Dr. Li Dong (Dolly) as part-time staff in partnership with the Coalition of Christian Outreach (CCO) to minister to international students on Ashland University's campus, and to pastor a multi-ethnic worship community. This worship community will build upon the ministry that Dolly has already had in Ashland over the last 10 years as pastor of the Ashland Chinese Church. Through this ministry over 30 people have been baptized into the Christian faith, most of which are now living for and witnessing to Jesus Christ in their home country! This has become, and indeed is for us, an exciting possibility to participate in God's mission of taking the gospel to the world by being faithful to minister to those from all around the world that have come to Ashland for their education; how exciting! I, along with the Session and some others in our congregation, have already been blessed by getting to know Dolly and some of the members of their worshiping community. We have much to learn from them as we become united in faith, ministry, and mission.

There are many details that will continue to be worked out in the weeks to come and we will seek to communicate those to you as they develop. In the meantime, Dolly will officially begin her work on June 1st and will spend the month of June in Pittsburgh for new staff training with the CCO. For this reason, the first service to be held at First Presbyterian Church will be on Saturday, July 7th. This new worshiping community will gather on Saturday evening's beginning with a potluck supper at 5:00pm in the Fellowship Hall and worship at 6:00pm in Andrew's Prayer Chapel. All are welcome!! We hope you will consider participating; this is indeed an exciting New Horizon for FPC.


AU FOOTBALL DINNER


