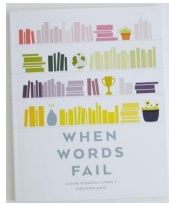

DON RINEHART LECTURE IN PRACTICAL THEOLOGY

Speaker: Author Hannah Brencher
Lecture: Come Matter Here

Hannah Brencher will be speaking on the subject of her recently published book *Come Matter Here* - a call for Christians to start living like they mean it here and now.



Hannah Brencher is a writer, TED speaker, and online educator with a heart for building leaders. Named as one of the White House's "Women Working to Do Good" and a spokesperson for the United States Postal Service, Hannah founded The World Needs More Love Letters in 2011. The global community has grown to over 20,000 individuals across six continents, fifty-three countries, all fifty states, and is established on over sixty-three college campuses.

The Rinehart Lecture in Practical Theology is an annual endowed public lecture honoring the memory and continuing the work of Dr. Don Rinehart who, in his 46 years of teaching at Ashland, inspired generations of students.

Dr. Peter Slade, chair of the Religion Department explained the choice of this year's lecturer. "We invited Hannah to speak because this idea of being a disciple right where you are is something that is important to us as a Brethren Church related school. This life of authentic witness and ministry was something that the late Don Rinehart and his wife Jan lived out right here in this school in rural Ohio for nearly half a century."



The Presbyterian Older Adult Ministries Network (POAMN) is bringing a major event to Ohio in October. A one-day regional conference will be held at Worthington Presbyterian Church (just north of Columbus) on Friday, October 12th. The theme is "The Best of Times: God's Call in the Third Thirty of Life." Opening the event will be a keynote address by Rev. Ray Jones, Acting Director of Theology, Formation & Evangelism at PC(USA) Louisville. In addition there will be 12 workshops from which to choose, covering a wide variety of topics such as:

- Through the eyes of the person living with dementia
- Navigating the Journey of Aging
- Models for neighborhood care by the Area Agency on Aging
- Social Justice and Older Adults
- How to reach those who are "Spiritual but not religious" (SBNR's)
- Missions for Older Adults
- Generational Generosity
- Our Third Thirty and the Seven Days of Retirement
- Overcoming Fears in the Third Thirty of Life
- Perspectives from a Panel of Retired Ministers
- Caregiving
- Open Q&A Session with the Keynote Speaker, Rev Ray Jones
