This new friendship opened the door for her to step out of her comfort zone and into one of her great strengths --showing hospitality. It is an expression of the cross-cultural ministry that God has been making a way for over the last year, and we can celebrate that this ministry is making its way into the hearts of students. In fact, Maddie expressed that her knowledge of the CCO's ministry to international students gave her strength to step into a relationship with Yeji. Let's praise God for this, and pray that He would use their friendship mightily in both Maddie and Yeji's life. May we continue to extend hospitality to others and may the Lord use it as a testimony of His heart for people.
