

Report on FPC Property

The exterior church doors will soon be reconditioned! Sun and the weather have necessitated a local vendor to treat each exterior door by removing and cleaning all door hardware, sand, stain and weather seal each door, reinstall all door hardware and each door to its opening.

Don't panic if you see exterior doors temporarily missing if you are driving by the church; they will be reconditioned on site at FPC. This work was included in the current property budget.

Much conversation has been raised recently regarding the church grounds and exterior. When the masonry contractor completed their work on the building exterior last year, they recommended that plants or shrubbery be planted a distance from the stone, as vegetation absorbs moisture and if in close proximity to stone will be most likely to impact the stone absorption of moisture.

Accordingly, two local landscaping vendors have reviewed the south and east elevations of the property and have submitted bids for landscaping services. Due to both vendors current spring work, landscaping work would begin in early June.

The work sought will include all stump removal of former shrubs on both elevations, fabric lining beneath all surfaces for weed control, decorative stone around all planted areas and a mixture of plants, floral and shrub to draw ones' eye to the focal points of the church facing Third Street and the Church Street office entrance. The property committee thanks the congregation for its patience as the exterior restoration continues into this summer.

The committee is also beginning to discuss long range planning for First Presbyterian Church

and future needs for our architecturally unique gem within the City of Ashland.
